Lionsgate site design goes to NJ EPA for approval Permitting process has begun

A conceptual plan for Bloomfield's Lionsgate Park was unveiled in June and the application to proceed will be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection in the coming weeks. Already, more than 50 percent of the \$9 million funding goal has been committed from state sources.

The acclaimed 18.5-acre reclamation project involves a "brownfield-to-greenfield" conversion of two flood-prone former factory sites that straddle the Third River and Spring Brook. Tens of thousands of cubic yards of historic debris and fill material will be excavated, to be replaced by freshwater wetland and flood storage area. The natural habitat will be restored and the public will enjoy a new park.

Bloomfield Mayor Michael Venezia cited multiple project benefits:

- Significant acreage will be created for wetlands and riverfront habitat.
- Downstream homes and

businesses that have flooded for years will see a lessening of flood risk, possibly slowing the increase of flood insurance premiums.

- Walking paths and passive recreation will be integrated into the public park.

- A daylight flex turf soccer field will address a shortage of Township soccer facilities.

In 2015, Bloomfield received the Governor's Environmental Excellence Award for the Lionsgate proposal. The award brought commitments of nearly \$5 million in state funds to carry out the project — more than half of the estimated \$9 million goal for grant funding. "That's our goal and hopefully even more," said Venezia. "We are very excited about the interest generated by state and federal



officials."

Because of its broad government approval, the development will become an important site for environmental study, since few sizable examples of brownfield-to-greenfield conversion exist in Essex County or the rest of northern New Jersey. The newly formed wetland, with its new flora and fauna, will become a laboratory of environmental study. In fact, the developmental plan includes two small classrooms where students from local colleges and Bloomfield schools will be

able to study the century-long transition from nature to industry and back to a nature again.

The reclamation start date now depends on the permitting process. Venezia said the site design supports policies endorsed by FEMA, the Army Corps of Engineers, EPA, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the NJ DEP.

Lionsgate "will add tremendous value to our community," he said.

When World War I was in progress, Bloomfield residents expressed pro-war and anti-war sentiments and raised money for both allied and German causes.

The town's dual-minded take on the times will be explored by lifelong Bloomfield resident Dean Cole in "Bloomfield 1914-1919: World War One & The Influenza Epidemic." The Historical Society of Bloomfield will host the event on Tuesday, Oct. 24, at 7:30 p.m. at the Civic Center, 84 Broad St.

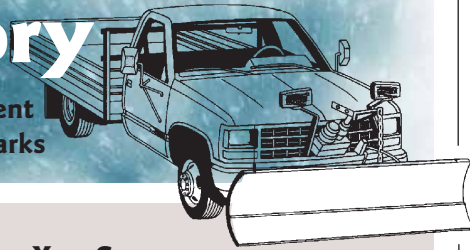

Snow Plowing Advisory

Bloomfield Department of Public Works & Parks



You May Need to Move Your Car

Below are rules for efficient snow removal on municipal streets.

(1.) If you live on a snow emergency street (see list), you are obligated to move your car once the street becomes snow covered.

(2.) Homeowners with driveways should remove vehicles from the street until plowing is finished.

(3.) Those without driveways can park in the following lots, after they are plowed:

- School playgrounds (not faculty lots), after Township authorization.
- Recreation Department parking lots: Felton Field (Floyd Avenue), Pulaski Park (Mt. Vernon Avenue), Upper Memorial Park (Division Street), Clarks Pond South (Hobson Street) or Wrights Field (Baldwin Place).

(4.) Major roadways will be plowed first for emergency access, then secondary arteries. All streets will be plowed.

(5.) Do not shovel snow back into streets when clearing driveways.

Snow Removal Tips

- Remove vehicles from the street to improve plowing.
- Parking on your frozen lawn in snow emergencies won't hurt it.
- Leave the last three feet of your driveway (the apron) covered with snow until the plow comes; avoid shoveling twice.
- If you must clear the apron quickly, pile snow on the left side (facing your home) to reduce plow-back into your driveway.

If your car is parked on one of the below streets (or street sections) during a snow emergency, it could be towed away by police.

UpTICK predicted this summer and fall

This year may see an increase in tick-borne diseases such as Lyme disease and rocky mountain spotted fever. If you walk in wooded areas or even spend time in your own backyard, check for ticks at the nape of the scalp, armpits, waist, sock line, groin and behind the knees. In forested areas, wear long-sleeved tops, long pants, socks and enclosed shoes. Avoid underbrush and use DEET repellents on exposed skin and clothing.

Please manage your garbage

Bloomfield Health proactively investigates quality-of-life violations by residents and commercial establishments. Here are a few township rules. For details, call (973) 680-4024.

- Remove waste receptacles and clean up garbage bag leaks within two hours of garbage pickup.
- Do not place bulky waste at the curb before 5 p.m. the day before collection. Remove within 2 hours after collection.
- Residential receptacles must be removed from the curb within 24 hours of collection.
- Business owners/occupants must broom-clean their sidewalks and curbs three times a day: within 30 minutes of opening, between noon and 1 p.m., and within 30 minutes of closing.

- **Cut it and leave it** is a lawn maintenance practice that improves your lawn the "green" way. Instead of raking, leave grass clippings in place as a top dressing that returns nitrogen to the lawn while reducing the need for fertilizer. The practice also lessens volume in the waste stream.
- **Cut grass high** (2½ to 3 inches) to encourage deeper roots that require less watering.
