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Greetings

Dear Residents,

Bloomfield Department of Health & Human Services (BDHHS) is pleased to present the 2021 Annual Report. This overview summarizes our efforts to prevent disease and promote physical and mental well-being in order to ensure the highest quality of life for the residents we serve. As we turned the page from 2020-2021, it was clear that the mission of the pandemic response was shifting. In addition to investigating cases, advising schools and care facilities on infection control measures, and tracing contacts, we undertook the enormous task of vaccinating our community. We worked hard to make sure vaccine was available to those most vulnerable to the virus' worst effects through educational campaigns, going door-to-door, and hosting community clinics. Our health education and nursing staff spent countless hours answering questions to help people understand the important role of vaccines in protecting everyone young and old. Our social workers provided mental health support, helped residents with unemployment claims, helped residents struggling with food insecurities, and assisted residents who were at risk of homelessness. And, just when we began to feel an underlying sense of comfort in the low levels of transmission and high levels of community vaccination, the unprecedented spike of cases driven by the Omicron variant struck our communities hard.

While COVID-19 continued to monopolize a great portion of our staff's time and efforts, we maintained the services that keep our community safe in many other ways. Our inspectors were out in town ensuring the safety of food being prepared in our local restaurants. Our public health investigators responded to concerns from local community members. Our registrars ensured residents could obtain marriage licenses through virtual ceremonies, even when meeting in person was unsafe. Our health education team continued outreach on COVID and non-COVID topics alike through community coalition meetings and social media, including monthly Instagram Live sessions with local experts. Additionally, we were proud to announce the re-launch of the Healthy Homes Program, an initiative to assist residents in assessing the environmental hazards that might be found in their homes, like lead and asthma triggers. Finally, Bloomfield Human Services was featured in May 2021 issue of Focus Magazine by the National Association of Social Workers discussing the newly-launched CARE program in which social workers work directly with police in response to 911 calls involving mental health/social issues.

After nearly two years of operating under a public health emergency, we could not be more proud of the dedicated staff who work every day to further the well-being of Bloomfield residents.







2021 KEY PROGRAMS

THE ENVIRONMENTAL TEAM HAS FOCUSED ON CREATING PROACTIVE PROGRAMS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE THROUGH REDUCING THE SPREAD OF DISEASE

GREEN & HEALTHY HOMES INITIATIVE

Implemented the Green and Healthy Homes Initiative; BDHHS inspectors completed 55 home assessments during which issues such as pests, moisture intrusion, deteriorated paint, air quality, and fire safety were addressed. On assessment completion, residents were provided with a free cleaning kit which included tools needed to keep their home healthy such as recipe cards for making green cleaning products, dusting tools, rubber gloves, sponges, etc.

TROPICAL STORM IDA

During the aftermath of tropical storm Ida, the Environmental Team canvassed hard hit neighborhoods and provided guidance to expediate repairs and find temporary solutions for residents, as well as FEMA application assistance. Affected restaurants were inspected and provided guidance on closure and food removal methods. Apartments and homes were inspected providing guidance on water intrusion concerns, mold, and uninhabitable residences.

2021 KEY PROGRAMS

THE HUMAN SERVICES TEAM HAS IMPROVED QUALITY OF LIFE VIA PROMOTION OF HEALTH, SAFETY, WELL-BEING, AND RIGHTS OF PERSONS RECEIVING SERVICES

CREATING A RESILIENT ENVIRONMENT (CARE)

The CARE Program was implemented with a mission to provide support to Township patrol units and residents while responding to non-violent calls related to mental illness, homelessness, domestic violence, or issues around aging in place. Clinical consultation from mental health professionals, including de-escalation strategies, are provided during crisis intervention and resolution. Post-incident, ongoing case management, follow-up care, linkage to services and coordination with other service providers are made available.

HEALTHY MEAL IN A BOX

In collaboration with local schools, the library, and Toni's Kitchen, *Healthy Meal in a Box* was implemented. Recipes and meals - emphasizing healthy ingredients and eating - were distributed to residents struggling with food insecurities. Over 500 family members benefited from the program.

PUBLICATION

Human Services was featured in May 2021 issue of *Focus Magazine* by the National Association of Social Workers. The article entitled "Bloomfield Township: Transforming Human Service and Law Enforcement Collaboration" was authored by BDHHS Director Karen Lore and Director of Social Work Paula Peikes; discusses the role of social work in working directly with police in response to 911 calls involving behavioral/social issues.


COMMUNITY WALK & BIKE PROGRAM

Implemented a Walk & Bike Program between April - June 2021. Over 40 community members registered to participate on launch day. The group, led by New Jersey Bike and Walk Coalition consultant covered 1.7 miles in 45 minutes with continuous police escort, ensuring pedestrian safety throughout the walk. The 12-week program brought together a total of 83 walkers from all age groups.

BLOOMFIELD FARMERS MARKET

Coordinated 18 weeks of fresh and affordable produce via City Green's Veggie Mobile. A total of \$2,699 worth of fresh produce were distributed to low-income families through funds from Neighbor to Neighbor Network and Supplemental Nutrition Program. Distributed 136 bento boxes with instructions on how to pack healthy lunches) through the Healthy School Lunches Initiative. Additionally, 296 "outreach bags" were distributed among market attendees; these included COVID19, chronic disease, physical activity, and healthy eating materials.

PRIORITY AREA 1: ACCESS TO SCREENING & HEALTH CARE SERVICES

GOAL: TO INCREASE ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE SCREENINGS FOR BLOOD PRESSURE, DIABETES, & OTHER CONDITIONS

- ★ Due to ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, all chronic disease screenings, as well as nursing collaborations with partners were on hold.
- ★ In lieu of screenings, electronic health education newsletters in English & Spanish languages were distributed to over 3,000 community members who are subscribed to BDHHS E-buzz. Topics included cardio-protective lifestyle modifications, how to read a nutrition label and tips to decrease salt intake, benefits of regular walking, tips for packing healthy school lunches, diabetes management, etc. Materials related to each topic was highlighted for the month on BDHHS Instagram and whenever possible, topic experts were brought onto IG Live for discussion and Q&A.

PRIORITY AREA 2: HEALTHY EATING & ACTIVE LIVING

GOAL: TO INCREASE ACCESS TO OPPORTUNITIES FOR HEALTHY EATING & ACTIVE LIVING

- ★ Implemented a Community Bike & Walk Program; the 12-week program brought together a total of 83 walkers from all age groups.
- ★ Coordinated City Green's Veggie Mobile in Bloomfield for 18 weeks during market season and saw the expansion of this program into the Bloomfield Farmers Market. BDHHS staff were present on-site to facilitate registration of eligible consumers for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP).

PRIORITY AREA 3: ENVIRONMENTAL RISKS

GOAL: TO INCREASE ACCESS TO ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH INFORMATION & ASSESSMENTS

- ★ Implemented the Green and Healthy Homes Initiative; 143 Bloomfield residents registered for the program and as of December 2021, 55 home inspections have been completed.
- ★ December 2021 newsletter - in English & Spanish - covered Safe Toys & Gifts Awareness Month. Lead poisoning information was covered and BDHHS REHS Jessi Cholewczynski was the IG Live topic expert.
- ★ Distributed approximately 300 informational flyers and resources on Healthy Homes and lead safety through five tabling events such as Back2School, Farmers Market, Fiesta Latina, etc.

PRIORITY AREA 4: MENTAL HEALTH & SUBSTANCE ABUSE

GOAL: TO INCREASE ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH & SUBSTANCE ABUSE RESOURCES

- ★ Funded the purchase of 46 books/ up-to-date resources on the topics of mental health and substance abuse for residents' use via Bloomfield Public Library.
- ★ June 2021 newsletter - in English & Spanish - covered Minority Mental Health Awareness Month; highlighted services and linkages available through Human Services to address mental disorders and issues related to self-esteem, grief, aging, and family concerns.
- ★ Promoted mental health tools/ resources and webinars on BDHHS Instagram throughout the year; topics covered include online recovery support groups, sober apps, information on opioid epidemic, Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids, Naloxone training, mental health and wellness, medication safety among seniors, vaping, etc.
