Save-A-Life Smoke Alarm Distribution Campaign

The “Save-A-Life Smoke Alarm Distribution Campaign” has come to the Township of Bloomfield. This program provides free 10-year sealed battery smoke alarms for households lacking in adequate smoke alarm protection. Designed largely to assist single family home senior citizens, low-income residents, households with children and other members of the community in need, the availability of these life-saving devices will ensure that all residents have the ability of having a working smoke alarm, aiding in the increased protection of the Bloomfield community.

Think Twice Before Cutting Back Your Flowers

As fall arrives, it's tempting to cut back "dead" flower stalks and seed heads, but doing so removes vital food and shelter for wildlife, according to the Bloomfield Environmental Commission. Many plants, including coneflowers, black-eyed Susans, sunflowers, Joe Pye weed, goldenrod, sedum, asters, ornamental grasses, and native berry-producing shrubs, provide seeds and berries that sustain birds like goldfinches, chickadees, cardinals, sparrows, and juncos throughout the winter. Hollow stems also serve as winter homes for native bees and butterflies, such as swallowtails, while fireflies and other beneficial insects overwinter beneath fallen leaves.

The Commission encourages residents to "leave the leaves" in garden beds and let plant stems stand until spring to support new growth. If you must move your leaves, use a rake instead of a blower—it's quieter, non-polluting, and good exercise!

Lithium-Ion Battery Safety Tips


